

Dr. YIP TAI CHING, M.B., B.S.

Dr. Yip Tai Ching, one of the most prominent physicians and surgeons of Hongkong, is a native of Hock-shan, Kwangtung Province, and was born in Hongkong in January 13, 1902.

He received his early education from the St. Paul's College. Many years later, he preceded to Canton and continued his studies in the Ling Nam University.

Having graduated from the University, Dr. Yip proceeded to London, England, in 1922 and took up the Medical Course in the London University.

In 1928, he was admitted as member of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, and concurrently, licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of London.

Dr. Yip graduated from the London University in 1929, and obtained the degrees of M.B., and B.S. Returning to the Colony in that year he started his own practice.

From 1923-1929, Dr. Yip studied in the St. Bartholomew's Hospital of the London University.

Dr. Yip is one who interests in public welfares. He was director of Chinese Y.M.C.A., Hongkong, in 1930; and in 1935, he became Vice-president of the same organization. He is also a life member and divisional surgeon of St. John's Ambulance Association, Hongkong.

Married to Chan Wai Fong in 1922, Dr. Yip has two children. The elder one is a girl and is receiving her early education in the St. Stephen Girls' College.
