Mr. CHAN TIT YAT.

Mr. Chan, born 1901, is a native of the Pun-U District, Kwangtung. He is one of the most famous and popular Chinese gentlemen now in the colony.

After receiving a high education, he began his business career. He first managed the Wing Yee Cheong Co., dealing in Java sugar. Then, for a year, he was editor of a news-agent. After this, he became, in different times, the Chinese manager of the Hong Kok Advertising Co., Ltd., General Manager of the South China Investment Co., and Manager of the Hongkong branch of the Tai Shan Life Insurance Co., (Shanghai).

However, Mr. Chan was still not contented with his success. He was regularly devoting an hour or two every day to improve himself by reading books on politics and economics and the teachings of the late Dr. Sun Yat Sen.

In 1923, he became a member of the Kuomintang, and during the General Strike in 1926, he went to Canton where he began his political activities. Though unknown to the people there at first, he soon attracted much attention by his wonderful articles appearing in different newspapers giving his views concerning the Strike and the chaotic political conditions of the country.

Meanwhile, Mr. Chien Ta Chui, the then Commissioner of the Bureau of Public Safety at Canton, came to know of the rare talents and ability of Mr. Chan and at once made him his private secretary. Then Mr. Chan gradually became known to many political and military magnates of the country especially when his brother-in-law, Mr. Chan Chi Cheng became the General of the First Revolutionary Army. He was therefore afterwards transferred from one important position to another which he filled with credit and satisfaction.

In recent years, Mr. Chan came back to Hongkong and devoted most of his energy to the work of education. He is now the Headmaster of the Mui Fong College, which under his able management, is rapidly becoming one of the most famous schools in the colony.

Mr. Chan is a man of broad sympathies, and every good cause finds him a ready and willing supporter. He has been the Committee member and Scout Master of the South China Athletic Association, Committee member of the Pun-U Chamber of Commerce in Hongkong, and the founder, and Chairman for the first year of the Supervising Committee and Chairman for the second, third and fourth years of the Executive Committee of the Chinese Teachers' Association. Besides these, he is also a member of many other social organizations.

Mr. Chan is skillful in swimming, Chinese Boxing, Jujitsu and riding, besides being an expert in palmistry and Phrenology.

Very recently, Mr. Chan was nominated by the Chinese Community of Hongkong for the election of delegates for the First Congress of China to be held in the near future.

Mr. Chan married to Miss Ng Man Chee, headmistress of Mui Fong Girls' College, in 1923, and he is now the proud father of three children.
