

One of the most prominent personages in the commercial sphere of Hongkong is Mr. Tse Yu Chuen. He is a native of Pun-U District, Kwangtung Province and was born in 1899. Having attained a good knowledge in Chinese literature, he entered the St. Joseph's College at the early age of cloven. For ten years, he stuck fast in the position and in 1935 he was promoted as Compradore of the firm.
